

Dear Cub Scouts and Parents,

It is our pleasure to provide you with this guide to the 2010 Cub Scout Day Camps. Please review all the information carefully.

The program is designed to meet the needs and interest of Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts. Activities will include: archery, crafts, songs and skits, games, nature, and much more. It will also serve as a day camp introductory program for the Tiger Cubs.

All camps will offer either a three or four-day camp for Cub Scouts and Webelos and a one or one-four day program for Tiger Cubs (contact Camp Director).

Registration and Fees:

Please register your entire pack at one time through the pack's Day Camp Coordinator.

Traditional Cub Scout Day Camp:

We will run four traditional Cub Scout Day Camps, similar to past years. Camp will start at 9:00 a.m. at each camp. The drop off time is 8:45 a.m. to 8:55 a.m. each day.

Pick up time vary depending on which camp you are attending:

- Boone County camps will end at 3:45 p.m. with pick up from 3:45 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. each day.
- Western Winnebago camp will end at 3:00 p.m. with pick up from 3:00 p.m. to 3:15 p.m. each day.
- Harlem camp and Alpine Park camp will end at 3:30 p.m. with pick up from 3:30 p.m. to 3:45 p.m. each day.

Twilight Cub Scout Day Camp:

Twilight Camp will be held July 6-9th at Alpine Park in Rockford. The number of campers will be limited so register as early as possible. The camp will run from 4:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m. The drop off time will be 3:45 p.m. to 4:00 p.m. and pick up from 9:00 p.m. to 9:15 p.m.

Health and Safety:

The following are strictly prohibited:

Weapons (of any kind)	Rock throwing
Toys or collectibles	Tree climbing
Disrespectful behavior	Running through camp
Bad language	Spitting
Biting	Fighting
Kicking	Leaving the boundaries of camp
Electronic Devices	

Boys who cannot follow these simple rules will be sent home!

We will be using the **buddy system** at Day Camp at all times. The Scouts are to stay in their assigned Day Camp Den the entire week. The Scouts will be placed with others from their pack when possible, but will have the opportunity for fellowship with Scouts from other packs.

Medical Information:

A certified medical officer will be present at all times during Day Camp. A Health History form for each person in camp **must** be on file. All medications – be it over the counter or prescription – must be checked in at the first aid station with the certified medical officer. **All medication, prescription or over-the-counter, must be in the original container and clearly marked with the Scout's name and pack number.**

Special Reminders:

Everyone is reminded that alcohol is **not allowed** at any Scouting event. Smoking is only permitted in designated areas when the Cub Scouts are **not present**.

What to Wear:

- 1) The day camp uniform will consist of the day camp T-shirt and your choice of long or short pants. Socks and shoes are required (**no sandals or Heelys**). Each boy must be in a day camp uniform for easy identification.
- 2) Be prepared for all weather.
- 3) All Twilight campers should bring a flashlight.

What to Bring:

- *Sack lunch/dinner and beverage
- Hat
- Raincoat or poncho
- Backpack
- Sun screen or sun block
- Flashlight (Twilight Only)
- Water non-breakable beverage container
- Insect repellent (non-aerosol)
- ALL** items should be marked with name and pack number.
- A den box will be provided to store extra gear.
- *All food items should not require refrigeration.

Transportation:

Transportation to and from day camp is the parent's responsibility. We recommend that you arrange a car pool with the adults attending from your pack. If someone other than the parents is going to pick up your son, we must have **written notice in advance** (this includes grandparents). All names must be listed on the Scout's Health History form.

A late drop-off will require you to bring your son to the day camp Headquarters area for sign-in. Early pick-ups will be the same – you must come to the headquarters area.

T-Shirts and Den Assignments:

Contact your Day Camp Coordinator to determine how t-shirts and den assignments are distributed. Camps distribute t-shirts and den assignments on the first day of camp.

Staff T-shirts are available for all volunteers at a price of \$7.00 per shirt. Please order on your registration form. If this area is left blank, no T-shirt will be ordered. **Four-day volunteers receive a free shirt if ordered by deadline date.**

Recognition:

A record of activities and patches will be distributed on the last day of day camp. It will be up to the parents to approve the completion of items (**when the parent is satisfied the boy has “done his best”**) and sign the appropriate book for advancement credit.

Required Leadership:

Each pack must provide at least one adult volunteer for every four Cub Scouts/Webelos Scout it sends. Each Tiger Cub Scout is to be accompanied by a Tiger Cub Partner. More volunteers are always welcome.

Wee Camp:

Wee Camp is available for the children of all adult volunteers **only** on the day(s) and times the adults are working in the day camp. **Children must be potty-trained.** There is a one-time fee of \$10.00 whether your child is there for just one day or all week. This fee covers the child's T-shirt, insurance, and program supplies. Wee Camp will be staffed by qualified adult leadership and will be open all hours of day camp except lunch. Parents are required to pick up their children during the lunch hour.

Registration:

Please register Cub Scouts and Webelos Scouts according to their rank in the fall of 2010 (i.e. Tiger Cubs will now be a Wolf for camp, Wolf Cub Scouts now will be Bear Cub Scouts for camp, etc.). No medical exam is required for day camp, but **EVERYONE** at camp must complete an individual Health History Form. This form is available from your pack Day Camp Coordinator. Completed forms signed by parent or guardian must be returned with the proper fee(s) to the pack Day Camp Coordinator. The Coordinator, in turn, will hand all of the pack's registrations in at one time to the Council office.

Deadline:

The registration fees:

- \$40 for Boone County Day Camps
- \$35 for Twilight camp, Western Winnebago camp, Harlem camp, and Alpine Park camp
- \$10 for the one-day Tiger Cub program
- \$10 per day or \$35 for the 4-day Tiger Cub program at Western Winnebago camp and Harlem camp.

Registration fees are due 4 weeks prior to camp, after which a \$10 late fee will be incurred. (Late registrations are not guaranteed a camp T-shirt on the first day of camp). Late fees will be waived for any newly registered Cub Scout or new pack. This fee includes the scout's T-shirt, patch, all program materials, insurance, and any recognition items used during the week.
